



The main objectives of the Pseudokarst Commission is organisation of the international Symposia on Pseudokarst and other events and meetings dedicated to the pseudokarst, as well as promotion and stimulation of activeness in the exploration and scientific studies of the non-karst caves and pseudokarst features. The Pseudokarst Commission has publicated the "Newsletter" ("Nachrichtenbrief") two times a year.

CURRENT AND PLANNED ACTIVITIES

- The crucial problem in the reported period was organization of the Commission assembly (meeting) which was planned during the 14th International Symposium on Pseudokarst. The ultimate term of this meeting is May 2023 and the meeting will be held in two ways: in the place and online, so as to make possible participation of highest number of members of the Commission.
- Despite the meeting problems, the number of the Commission members has distinctly increased and the more important the composition of the Commission has been evidently rejuvenated.
- In the Commission Assembly held during this Symposium new objectives and ways of their realization by the Commission, adequate to modern possibilities and challenges, will be discussed and then implemented.
- Obviously the **election of new executive group** of the Commission will be held, and new, young functionaries will be appointed. Nevertheless, all the Commission members are still requested to look for young people working on pseudokarst and ask them to join the Commission.
- The traditional previously and currently realized activeness of the Commission, is and will be continued, so the Pseudokarst Commission Newsletter will be issued, the website will be managed, the activity of Commission members in other media (UIS Bulletin, etc.) will be visible.
